

- Funded by four Gas Distribution Networks + IGEM + Domestic & General + CoGDEM












Environmental Audit Committee inquiry on outdoor and indoor air quality

Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Alarm Regulations

- 1 October 2022
- For rented properties & new builds/new installations
- Cookers excluded
- No grace period for landlords
- Duty to repair/replace alarms when informed
- Tenants to change batteries

Tolerable Standard

- 1 February 2022
- Mandatory alarms regulation for all homes
- Cookers are excluded from the regulations
- Must meet the relevant British Standards (EN 50291-1)
- Requirement to be interlinked (not CO)

Renting Homes (Wales) Act 2016, Properties 'Fit For Human Habitation' FFHH, 2022 regulations

- Regulations launched 1 December 2022
- For rented homes only
- Gas cookers are included
- Alarms must be fitted and maintained by the landlord
- Wide landlord duties incl. ventilation, flues & appliance servicing
- Recent consultation on expansion
