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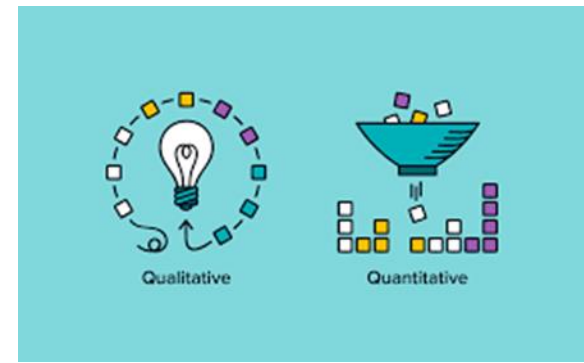

Why 'qualitative'?



- Data is in *language form*
- Answers questions like *why...* allows for **exploration** of the ill-defined
- Helps understanding of subtleties and **complexities**
- Helps understanding of the **context** and environment
- Hearing people's own words (their *voices*) helps us **understand** their position
- When the measurements don't fit well, qualitative research helps uncover the right things to **measure**
- Qualitative research is systematic and rigorous with quality concepts

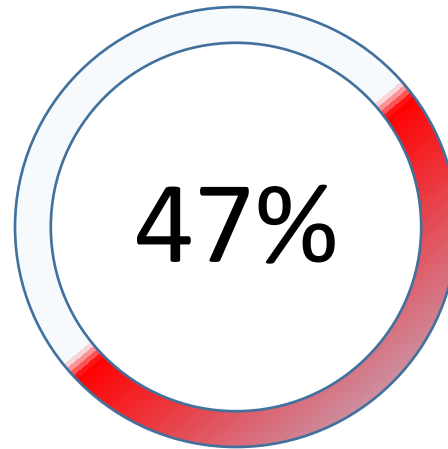

C/PTSD in military veterans and Ecotherapy

- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) is a defined medical disorder that is common among Veterans
- Number of surveyed ecotherapy users reporting poor or very poor mental health:



- Ecotherapy, where being close to nature acts as therapy, allows Veterans to have some respite from their symptoms, some comradeship, and find some purpose by re-engaging with nature

Small communities

How can we work more closely with small communities?

- Exploring what it means to be misrepresented/seldom heard
- Participatory Action Research ‘nothing about me, without me’

1. Irish Traveller study:

We aim to:

- Investigate whether there are ambient levels of CO within the caravans
 - Explore the anecdotal evidence that members of the community have previously shared, suggesting that they have some experience of issues related to CO
 - Using the PAR approach to produce a culturally-appropriate information booklet about CO
 - Potentially use the data from this study to inform a larger, national study in order to explore CO-related issues with the wider Traveller community
- Local Authority site
 - ICC – brokers relationships



2. Ecotherapy study:

- We aim to:
- Investigate whether there are ambient levels of CO within the tents and awnings used as shelter/accommodation by the residents of the Ecotherapy retreat
- Explore any levels of knowledge and understanding of lower levels of CO exposure, especially those that may result from 'wild living' and the effects this may have on someone with PTSD
- Produce, using photos taken by the veterans and the PAR approach, a culturally-appropriate information booklet/posters about CO for this community



Summary

- Working with hard to reach/hard to help communities such as Irish Travellers and veterans with C/PTSD
- They can be very vulnerable to CO
